population out of the technology loop. In a technology-access survey of the twenty-two most economically developed nations, America ranked twenty-first.

Without an immediate concentration on technology preparation at the community level, this position will not change.

In addition, a 'good-start' policy provides basic training to each group of recipients so that benefits of technology access have almost immediate effect.

As a management resource, The On It Foundation coordinates the transfer of used and residual technology resources to the people who need it most. The Foundation navigates language difficulties and scheduling conflicts. Follow-up and support creates solid community luminaries who affect a larger sphere of technology access.

They are students, mothers, laborers, and service workers; they attend classes and complete training. They are part of the surge of family and community effort fueling

the success of The On It Foundation. As participants in The On It Foundation programs, individuals and families enhance society by providing career opportunities to the least employable, gain tools for bridging language barriers, facilitating cultural exchange, and assist in economic development for technology-challenged communities. It's work represents one of the strong tools for making American citizens prepared for competition in the technology-bound 21st century.
